



Geraldine Bagley Foundation Scholarship

Eligibility Requirements and Procedures

This scholarship was established in 1999 by the late Geraldine Bagley, and is designed to give financial assistance to high school seniors/graduates of Siuslaw High School (Florence, Oregon) or Mapleton High School (Mapleton, Oregon) who intend to pursue higher education. The scholarship is administered by the Trust Department of Oregon Pacific Bank.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must be a senior at either Siuslaw High School or Mapleton High School.
2. Applicant must demonstrate intent to pursue either an academic or vocational career in an accredited college, university or vocational institution.
3. Applicant must prove financial need by submitting pertinent information to the scholarship committee.
4. Applicant must provide the following documents with the application:
 - A. Grade transcript.
 - B. SAT scores and/or ACT scores.
 - C. One letter of recommendation.
5. Other factors involved in selecting the candidate will be those relating to community service or extracurricular involvement.

The scholarship to be awarded will be in the amount of \$20,000, to be distributed at the rate of \$5,000 per year for four years. Recipient will receive payment semi-annually upon receipt of preceding school term grade transcript as a full-time student. A minimum of 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) must be maintained. It is the student's responsibility to provide the Bagley Foundation Scholarship (BFS) Committee (P.O. Box 22000, Florence, Oregon 97439) with the necessary grade transcript. This should be within 10 days of the end of the reporting period. Failure to claim the scholarship within one school year will result in forfeiture.

Procedures

Bagley Foundation Scholarship (BFS) Committee will inform Siuslaw High School (SHS) and Mapleton High School (MHS) of the scholarship availability. The scholarship will be publicized by the two high schools.

Applications are due to the Trust Department of Oregon Pacific Bank no later than the first Friday following Spring Break (April 5, 2019). They can be mailed or delivered to: 1365 Highway 101, PO Box 22000, Florence, OR 97439. The BFS Committee will act on the applications; selection will involve an interview with the scholarship candidates.

The award is to be announced and presented according to the school's method of presentation. The award will be accompanied by a letter of instruction detailing how the money is to be disbursed to the student.
